



***Zafar Gondal***, former senior judge, Director National Accountability Bureau and technical specialist justice and rule of law UNDP/UNSOM is an established rule of law, governance, regulatory and institutional reforms and development law practitioner, who has well over three decades of practical field experience as a senior magistrate and judge, attorney and public prosecutor in Pakistan, anti-corruption legal and institutional advisor, counter terrorism and organized crimes adviser; justice, human rights and rule of law specialist; international law and development advisor; public policy and legislative drafting expert in several other jurisdictions. He has also extensive research and experience of working across the justice sector, legal system and legal cultures. He is author of several published articles on essentials of sustainable and good laws, rule of law and development, common language and standards for sustainable laws, anti-corruption strategy, international standards for transparency, accountability and answerability, organized crimes and several development tools and process.
